The signs of someone who's been trafficked

Human trafficking may occur locally or domestically, without any movement, such as within the same city.

Victims may be isolated and/ or taken to illicit businesses where they may be subjected to physical and sexual abuse and concealment. They may be forced to perform a variety of services including working in the sex trade, factories, restaurants, agriculture, or providing domestic work.

How would you recognize a victim?

(usually includes a combination of indicators)

- she may be controlled or intimidated by someone else (i.e. being escorted or watched)
- she may not speak on her own behalf and may not be English/ French speaking
- 3. he may not have a passport or other I.D.
- 4. he may not be familiar with the neighborhood he lives/works in
- 5. she may be moved frequently by her traffickers
- 6. she may have injuries/bruises from beatings and/or weapons

- 7. he may show visible signs of torture i.e. cigarette burns, cuts
- 8. he may show visible signs of branding or scarring (indicating ownership by the trafficker)
- 9. they may show signs of malnourishment
- 10. they may express fear and intimidation through facial expressions and/or body language

There are very few clear black and white indicators of human trafficking.
