

# A Call to Pray and Fast in April

## THE PLAN

**1. Decide if you'd like to say yes to this call to join Baptist Women in prayer and fasting** Pray. And also ask women at church if they'd like to join.

**2. Choose your type of fast**

- Choose which meal(s) you will skip each Sunday
- If you have health issues, fast from something else, e.g., television, social media
- Try to find a time to gather as a group to pray

**3. Gather every Sunday**

Every Sunday, gather as a group to pray. There are several ways to do so:

- *Read aloud* Psalms such as Psalm 23 or 46. Then pray them in your own words as prayers of praise, thanksgiving, confession, yearning or intercession.
- *Use the prayer prompts* as a way to focus your prayers
- *Pray through the alphabet*—praising God (e.g., God, you are awesome in holiness).

What would God like you and the group to talk to Him about? Ask Him.

**4. Keep a record (journal)**

Choose someone to record what God says to the group: Scripture; new insights into Scripture; a word or phrase meant to encourage Baptist Women at large.

**5. Let Baptist Women know how it went**

Perhaps God is telling us something as an organization. Please reach out and share your experiences with us.

## 5 PRAYER PROMPTS

**1. Psalm 27:8 (NLT)**

My heart has heard you say, "Come and talk with me." And my heart responds, "LORD, I am coming."

**2. Isaiah 42: 1 and 3 (NIV)**

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him . . . A bruised reed he will not break and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out.

**3. John 7:37-38 (NIV)**

On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them."

**4. Psalm 46:10 (NLT)**

Be still and know that I am God! I will be honored by every nation. I will be honored throughout the world.

**5. Philippians 2:13 (NLT)**

For it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.
